First page:

On official occasions the flag is raised above the Rathaus or town hall in Bremen. Its red and white stripes and cubes have earned it the nickname "bacon flag". The state coat of arms with its two keys and three lions adorns the centre.

Previous page:

This terrace is a typical example of the Bremer Haus, found in this form only in Bremen. Streets of houses like these were built between 1880 and 1930 and many boasted a spacious conservatory.

Below:

There are many pleasant little villages in the area around Bremen, such as the former artists' colony of Fischerhude whose development was inextricably linked to that of Worpswede. One of the most popular venues here is Körbers Gasthof.
