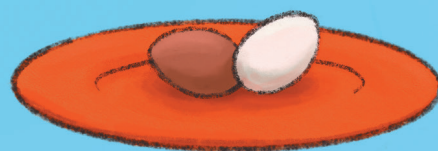

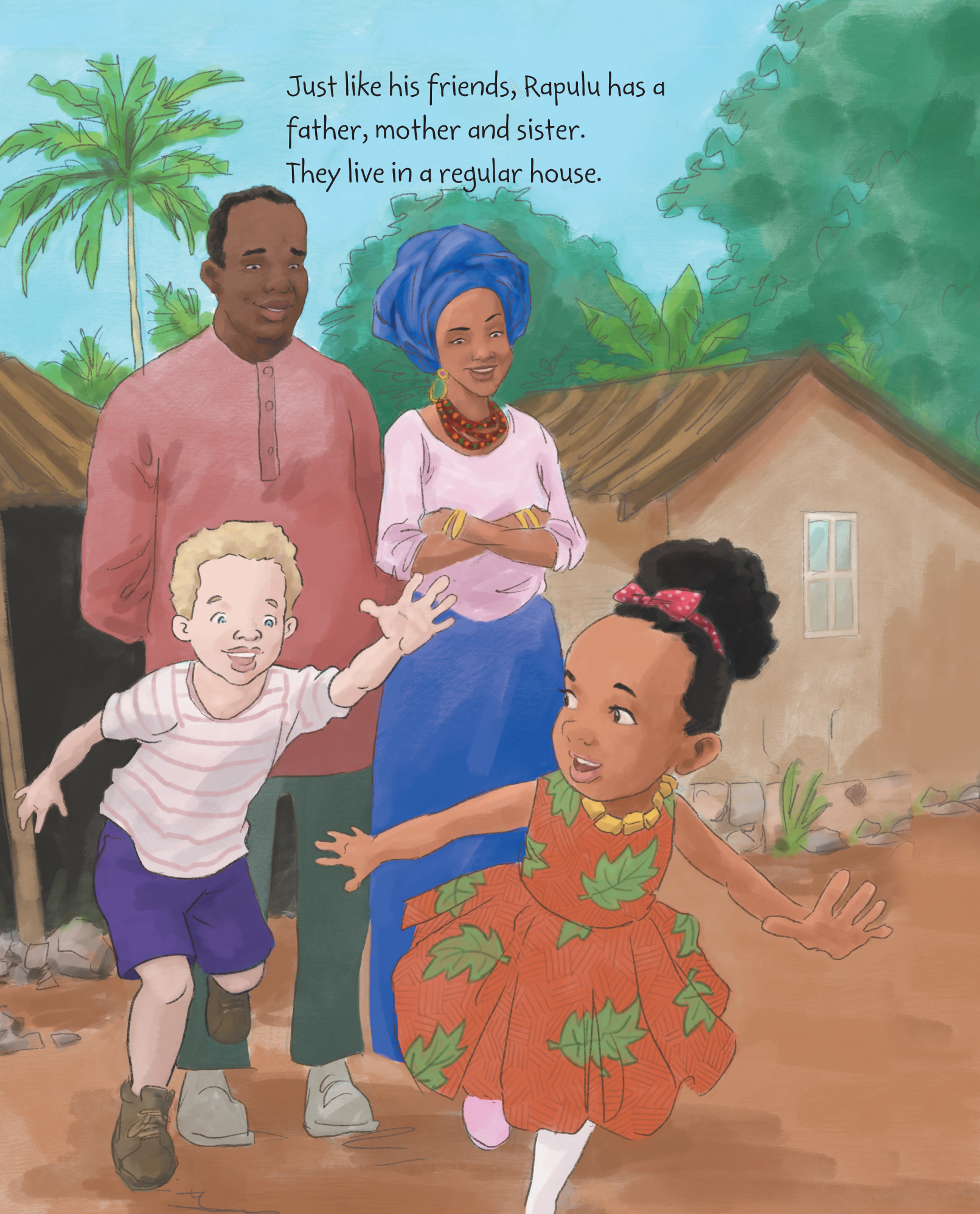
Somewhere in the very heart of Nigeria, near where
