Chapter 1 - YHWH in the Indian Rigveda

येशुः तान् अवदत् , ॐ अहं युष् माकं वदामि, अब्राहमस् य

This saying of Jesus in the Bible is generally accepted as the revealing oath of the Messiah, with which he expresses his immortal and timeless nature. He claims to be the one who lives forever and ever and already had the Word in the so-called Old Testament of Holy Scripture.

Since this means in summary "He is the one who is", the Jews in the following verses sought to stone him on what they considered to be a blasphemous statement - they did not succeed, however.

This statement becomes all the more fascinating when one considers that the Indian

Rigveda already mentions the God of the Bible by name, as well as his son. Yes, read it correctly. I will also prove it to you below using the Indian scriptures. Here is a little bit of information in advance to help you understand.

The oldest writings of Hinduism are the so-called Vedas or the Veda. Consisting of four writings, the Rigveda, Samaveda, Yajurveda, and Atharvaveda. The oldest part of the Hindu scriptures is the Rigveda.

First, a purely oral tradition of revelation songs in early Vedic language. According to current estimates, these chants were written down by the so-called Rishis - the saints of the Vedic epoch - around the year 1,200 BC in Devanagari script in the Sanskrit language in the form of today's Rigveda.

The Rigveda contains these songs of praise, divided into 10 circles of songs, the mandalas. Each mandala consists of a series of
