# INTRODUCTION

Latvia reveals its sacred traditional heritage through musical sanctuaries that have survived all centuries since the beginning of time. The melodic voice of the kokle creates mournful sounds like a zither through its chordophone body as it joins Latvian chanting traditions guided by eerie polyphonic harmonies that are descended from Finno-Ugric and Baltic heritage sounds. Throughout history these interminable musical intervals have served as life-force for both musicians and tonalists in

Latvia. The natural universe and terran sustenance provided a fertile environment for these musical forms which originated from its abundant space.

Latvia's foremost ethnomusicologists devote their entire life to sacramentally develop the detailed documentation of Latvian traditional music since they honor its ancient musical heritage above all else through their precise scientific method. Through their tireless efforts they defended promissory cultural heritage as well as serving as an eternal muse for contemporary artists to explore traditional sources for original artwork.

Through its precise control of cappella singing and partnerships with famous composers the choir has become Latvia's cultural representative in musical expressions.

Latvian instrumental music together with choral tradition continues to develop its own distinct

identity through the exceptional talents of both composers and instrumental performers. For more than a century the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra has established itself as a cultural institution through its constant delivery of breathtaking musical performances which demonstrate Latvia's cultural talent in music.

The orchestra plays Latvian composers' masterpieces under distinguished conductors who perform both romantic works by Janis Ivanovs and avant-garde pieces by Pēteris Vasks. The cultural masterpiece collection of gain Latvia continues to international recognition which establishes Latvia as a vital force worldwide classical in music

The contemporary music scene in Latvia shows remarkable strength because popular music has regained its popularity in the last few years. The nation's musical prodigies have succeeded worldwide in both Latvian pop rock and electronic music space.

International audiences now recognize the

artists Brainstorm along with the moving pop ballads of Kristīne Prauliņa as representatives of distinctive Latvian popular music.

The growth of music festivals and events which include Positivus Festival and the Saulkrasti Jazz Festival gives Latvian artists established and upcoming musicians opportunities to present their music to diverse audiences.
