

#### Alana Smith, bartender



Come on, Olivia. You know I love you – as a friend. Let's talk about this at the bar. I hate texting about things like this. BC  $\circ$  01:23 p.m.


We could be more than just friends! If you can't see that, you're making a big mistake that you'll regret! 0J • 01:27 p.m.


