You Are God's Strategy

UNDERSTANDING THE POWER OF VISION

“Where there is no vision, the people perish...” –
Proverbs 29:18 (KJV)

What Is Vision, Really?

Vision is more than just a dream. It is more than setting goals or having ambitions. In the kingdom of God, **vision is divine insight into your future that is revealed by the Holy Spirit.** It is God’s blueprint for your life, your assignment, and your impact.
