First page:

This lime tree with crucifix stands in the little village of Schlitten, now part of Wessobrunn. Its counterpart is in Wessobrunn itself, with the famous Wessobrunn Prayer inscribed on a stone slab under the tree.

Previous page: In the evening light the statue of Mary, the Frauenkirche and the

Neues Rathaus with its tower and chimes effuse a magical charm.

Below:

The rafts used on the River Isar – seen here between Wolfratshausen and Thalkirchen – now no longer transport goods such as wine, chalk, plaster or marble but visitors from near and far. Page 10/11: Looking east from the top of the Zugspitze. The highest mountain in Germany in the Wetterstein Range, its first known mention as the "Zugspitz" was in 1590. Over 200 years later

in 1820 Karl Naus was the first to set foot on the summit 2,963 metres (9,721 feet) above sea level.
