Rolihlahla Dalibhunga Mandela was born on 18 July 1918 in a small village in the Eastern Cape of South Africa. He was one of 13 children.

In 1993 Mandela and F. W. de Klerk won the Nobel Peace Prize. A year later he became the first black President of the new South Africa.

When Mandela was nine years old, his father died, and Mandela became the royal leader of his tribe*.




c ○ After he finished school, Nelson Mandela studied law at university. He also enjoyed boxing and running.

In 1990, Mandela was released* from prison by the Prime Minister, Mr FW De Klerk.

In 1964, he went to prison for life 'trying to bring down the government'. He spent 18 of his years in prison on Robben Island.

At the age of seven, he became the first member of his family to go to school. At that time, all black children were given English names by teachers. Rolihlahla became Nelson.

As a lawyer and member of the African National Congress, he fought against the system of apartheid* in South Africa.
