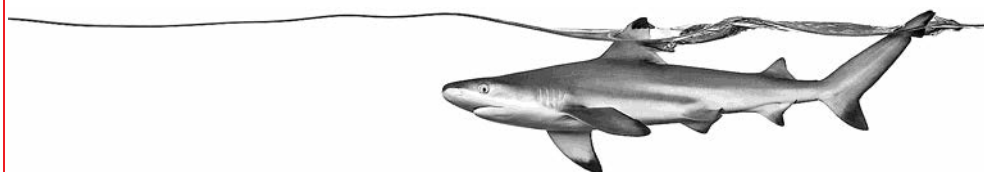

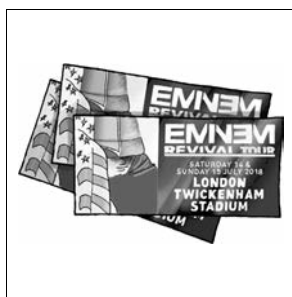

Nicki: Not quite. I was in my last year at school and I wanted to do something different. Lots of my friends were talking about jobs and so on ... and I was thinking: freedom, adventure, fun. Then one day I was surfing the internet looking for things I could do when I read about a group of people doing a study of sharks – shark research – and they wanted someone to help them.
Adam: Sharks aren't exactly friendly, are they? Weren't you worried about them?
Nicki: A little bit on the plane. But later I learnt so much about them. They've got a bad name, but that's not fair. They don't often attack people but when they do, it's often a mistake ... and, apparently, people don't taste nice.
Adam: Oh, that's something!
Nicki: No, what I mean is sharks see people in wetsuits or on surfboards and they think: "Yummy, seal for dinner." So, if they're hungry they'll take a bite and then go, "Yuk, that's horrible!" There are usually just over 80 shark attacks every year in the whole world and only about five people are killed: dogs kill 25,000 people and crocodiles 1,000! Top of the table of bad guys are mosquitoes – actually did you know only the females bite? Anyway, ... way down in 15th place is the poor shark.
Adam: Can you do anything to make the risk of a shark attack even less?

- Nicki: Sure. Always go into clear water – then a shark can see if you're a seal or not. Don't go into the sea in the early morning or late evening – sharks like to hunt then. And if you can, stay close to other people – sharks don't like groups.
Adam: Interesting. Let's take a break and play some music and we'll be back with Nicki in a few minutes.
